Course Description:

This course of study provides instruction on utilizing a humanistic approach to provide basic care to people in a variety of health care settings. Students will understand how health care systems operate and will learn the skills necessary to function safely and efficiently in a health care setting. Students will learn the information and practical skills necessary for taking and passing the certification examination required by the state.

Course Objectives: Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Understand the role and responsibility required of a nursing assistant working in a health care setting.
- 2. Perform basic and personal care skills according to the individual needs of the patients, residents, and clients in the health care setting.
- 3. Describe different long-term care settings and the special needs of residents who live in long-term care facilities.
- 4. Develop a basic understanding of body structure and function so that abnormal changes can be easily observed and reported.
- 5. Discuss how knowledge of the stages of growth and development helps plan holistic care and recognize each person's individual needs.
